



Poetry Recital Competition Rules

Kindergarten- 2nd Grade

- 1. Participants must be students from Kinder to 2nd grade.
- 2. One participant per school.
- 3. An I.D. number will be assigned to each participant during the registration process.
- 4. The student must provide three (3) copies of the selected rhyme, which are to be given to the judges before the beginning of the recitation. The judges will provide a value of one (1) point will be given to this criterion.
- 5. The rhyme length should be three (3) to four (4) stanzas long.
- 6. The student must memorize the rhyme and should not be reading.
- 7. Students will perform for the judges.
- 8. The judges' decision will be final.
- 9. Students can submit the recital via video. It should not be edited and without pauses.
- 10. Students must wear their school uniform throughout regional and central level competitions.

Contest Criteria

- 1. The judges will evaluate the student on their accuracy of memorizing the rhyme and fluency in the poem's delivery.
- 2. Judging of students will be based on their voice projection, pronunciation, speed, and intonation.
- 3. Student's body language will be judged also.
- 4. Costumes and props are not allowed.
- 5. Judges' decisions will be final.

Note: English teachers and facilitators must explain the rules and rubric to all students and parents.
